Acting Comp. Sec. Report

April 8, 2024

Most issues have been 'big surprise' weather related!

Spring Open.

We had to cancel the spring men's 4BBB Open. I think going forward; we have to consider removing this event from our Calendar. It is not one of our bigger revenue streams and with increasingly wet weather; it seriously impacts the green staff's preseason course preparations. We want visitors to experience our course in the best possible condition to encourage their return. This would mean delaying it till around until mid-May, moving it too close to our summer opens.

Easter Competitions.

These will be rescheduled to a later date.

Captains Day

The joint Captains day is pencilled in for the 13th July. The 20th is also available if the 13th is not suitable. I will sort out the competition format with Graham.

2025 Calendar.

I have set up a provisional 2025 men's fixture list on B.R.S. and Club V1. This will give us plenty of time to make any alterations.

Preferred Lies.

The county has given clubs permission to extend preferred lies into May if required.

In the past we have only allowed preferred lies to be taken on closely mown areas, equivalent to the height of the grass on the 1st fairway. I was always in favour of this as I believe, it rewarded straight hitters. I now think, because of increasingly wet winters, we should change this to the general area for next year. (All areas excluding penalty areas and bunkers.) This enables golfers to clean – remove mud from their golf balls.

Daffodils.

I have reinstated in the temporary local rule giving relief from growing daffodils until preferred lies end. Several notices have been posted.

Open Events.

As better ball competitions are now being used for handicapping, these events must be run through Club V1 or a similar programme. I have printed a user guide to help. Whilst not being willing to do any more full day shifts, I am more than willing to help in the lead up to these events. From experience, you need two computers available throughout the day to sign in / register teams and record scores. Having someone on standby in case of player cancellations helps take some of the stress away from what are high pressure days for those running them. First tee starters are also a help.

I have liaised with Ross regarding the first Seniors Open in May and will be available to help if required in the lead up.

Diane and the Ladies managed well running last year's Ladies Open and again I will be available to help if required.

Men's Competitions.

To avoid any more early morning phone calls, I have produced an idiot card for each competition. (Not sure if this is the correct term but it seems appropriate!)

Each card details the competition format, handicap allowance, tees for the day and any other relevant information. These will be posted, in advance, on the men's competition board in the clubhouse. The clubhouse should always be open before the first players tee-off.

I have started disqualifying players for not returning their scores in a timely manner. (Within 5 hours of starting their round.)

As discussed last year, following E.G.U. guidance, players are no longer required to submit scorecards.

Scores must be entered through the How-did-I-do Application or on the Clubhouse P.S.I. terminal by a designated marker. (As a last resort, they can also be entered through the Pro. shop or Office.) Players cannot mark their own scores.

Minimum number of competitors in Men's events.

I believe in the past there had to be a minimum number of competitors before competition could stand. I have searched through the archives but cannot find what that number was. I would suggest a minimum of 20 players in any 18 hole competition or the event is either abandoned or rescheduled.

Winter greens

Just my personal thoughts, but it seems to me, to keep the course open, we are going to be using winter greens more and more. I would suggest locating these well away from the summer greens as we have done on the 14th. Playing a hole 50yards shorter than normal is better than not playing golf at all. This should help protect both the summer greens and surrounds from excess wear and tear.

March /April Report and Plan.

March.

- Weather report – 136 mm (5.5 inches) rainfall which ranged from 16mm to 39mm per week with 6 days CLOSED and 6 days reduced course.
- Managed to mow weekly on majority of greens, tees, fairways and aprons – rough areas to wet to mow with many waterlogged areas throughout.
- Fairways Slit tined with new slitter once when weather permitted
- Last of machinery serviced and all cylinders back from grinding
- Many areas in rough have standing water or waterlogged
- 17th Fairway still waterlogged with several puddles not shifting throughout month
- 10th fairway still waterlogged with large puddled area centre and right throughout month. Quote provided for drainage works to resolve as existing drainage too deep and not working – possible blockage in copse but more likely water not reaching existing drains. Fairway verti-drained and slit with no benefit.
- All irrigation heads on tees and greens raised to level.
- All greens had lawnsand applied to help combat moss and harden up as and when weather allowed.
- All bunkers and tee banks flymowed once
- New course furniture i.e. flags, cups and pins arrived ready for putting out April

April.

- Weather report 1st – 15th April – 102mm (4 inch) so far with 8 days CLOSED and 3 days reduced course
- Mowing weekly of all areas – once it was dry enough to mow rough our 4500 rough mower broke down with major issue (still currently under repair at large cost) now we have a loan one it has become too wet in many areas again but mowing as and when we can but will take several weeks to reach standard and lose grass clippings. Unfortunately we cannot mow semi until this is completed and dry enough for semi mower. Several greens still way to wet to walk on never mind mow. Quote provided for Drill n Fill machine to help with drainage and drying out for future.
- All greens pencil tined to close up previous verti-drain holes
- All bunkers edged and weeded by end of this week.
- Resignation of Andrew Burrell (last day 26th April) and advert out looking for suitable qualified replacement.

Rest of April /Start of May

- Season tee markers to put out back on main tees.
- New flag pins / flags / hole cups to put out
- 150 yard markers to add and these will be to the MIDDLE OF THE GREENS.
- Ropes and pins to bring in from course once conditions permit
- Fertiliser applications to greens, tees, approaches ASAP / chemical applications the same.
- Spray liquid iron and minimum fertiliser to fairways and semi-roughs.
- Main aeration week scheduled for Tuesday 29th / Wednesday 30th but may have to be put back if greens have not dried out enough

- Benches to put back out once conditions permit.
- Irrigation boxes and heads to trim around.
- Irrigation system to reinstate / open and repairs carried out.
- Drainage to repair / add to spring on 12th approach when ground conditions permit
- Divot tees and rake bunkers daily to improve appearance.
- Plus anything else required throughout the month – and if we can fit it in
